SHORT CURRICULUM VITAE

Stavros Apotsos is an architect specialized in historic preservation since 2016 and he has been a practicing architect since 2009. Born in 1981, he lives and works in Thessaloniki. He graduated from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and obtained a postgraduate degree in the Protection, Conservation and Restoration of Architectural Monuments. Today he is a PhD candidate in the Department of Architecture at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and works on his Ph.D. research on "The Architecture of the Railways in the North-Hellenic region at the end of the Ottoman Period".

He worked at the Major Development Agency of Thessaloniki and was a member of the study and design group for the reuse and restoration of the army building A2 in the former Ottoman camp, which is now turned into the metropolitan park Pavlos Melas. In previous years, as a free lance architect he has worked at several building restorations and surveys of historic buildings as well as archaeological sites.

Since 2014 he has participated in various scientific teams and research programs and he is a member and coordinator of a research project conducted by «MONUMENTA NGO» with the title "Documentation and Promotion of all 19th & 20th century (1870-1940) buildings in Thessaloniki". In 2017 he participated in the research group entitled "Architecture and Business Areas in the former Frankish Quarter of Thessaloniki" directed by Professor V. Colonnas, department of Architecture, University of Thessaly, for the Piraeus Bank Group Cultural Foundation.

He was awarded the 1st prize in two pan-Hellenic architectural competitions: In 2016 he won the competition for the "Restoration & reuse of the stable complex and its surroundings, within the port of Thessaloniki", (organizer: Thessaloniki Port Authority) and in 2018 in the "Panhellenic architectural competition for ideas for the renovation of the area of O.S.E. SA Kozani train-Station".

He is the main author of 4 conference announcements in Greece, Europe and the US, while he has 2 publications in international scientific journals (Cambridge Scholars and Springer Nature).

Since 2016, he is adjunct staff at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Department of Architecture, participating in several courses such as "Introduction to Restoration of Historic Buildings", "Historical Building Systems", "Designing along the Architectural Heritage" and "Restoration and Reuse of Historic Buildings and ensembles".

He speaks Greek, English and German.
